Thanks to partnerships, donors, volunteers, and staff, CTN's capacity to provide affordable and dependable specialized transportation to seniors, persons with disabilities, low income families, children and youth has grown. Riders and their families value a service that is dependable. CTN works hard to schedule more than 90% of its medical requests and 100% of agency requests. We also get riders to their destinations on time and pick them back up on time or earlier if needed.

A dependable service treats riders with compassion and remains affordable, especially for those who ride frequently. Our sliding fee scale is higher than public options, with no passenger assistance, and lower than fees of for-profit providers. Donations and foundation support make this possible.

CTN is a local community experiment in collaborations. The efficiencies and effectiveness will be apparent as you read this report.

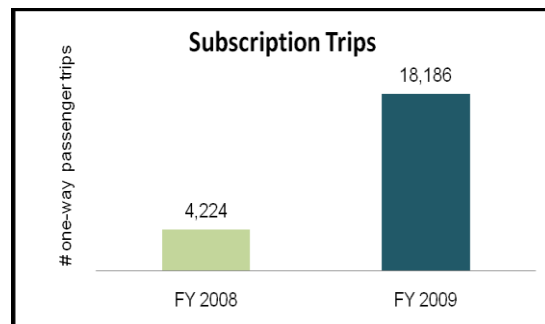
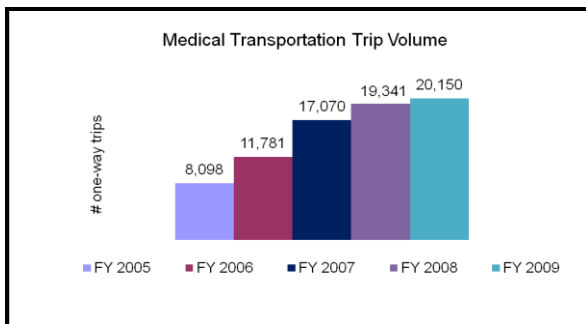
### Program Highlights

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Medical trips increased another 4% over the previous year. Our capacity is due in part to a continued **partnership** with Turnstone. CTN drives and maintains four of their vehicles.

Subscription trips, non-medical trips contracted with other organizations, soared 77% this year due to another strategic partnership with Community Action of Northeast Indiana's Head Start. CTN currently uses five school buses, owned by CANI, to provide field trip transportation for CANI Head Start program locations as well as for other organizations. The Carson and Rosemary Noecker Foundation also donated funding to purchase a 26 passenger transit bus to accommodate larger groups more efficiently.

**38,336 trips in total were provided for \$3 less per trip than the previous year!**



**559 riders** were served by the medical transportation service. Most of those riders are low income. 42% were minorities and 50% were age 60 or older. Our oldest rider was 98 years old and our youngest was 2. CTN's transportation reaches every neighborhood and all age spans. 70% of our riders were new to the service during the year. 92 riders rode more than 100 times, some of them more than 300 times. These Fort Wayne/Allen County riders used our services to return home from the hospital, to access life sustaining dialysis treatment three times a week, to attend adult day services at least once a week, and to get to a vast array of medical care providers. They all received affordable, accessible, dependable service with our customary door-through-door, arm-in-arm, hand-to-hand assistance. Service is provided in Fort Wayne/Allen County.

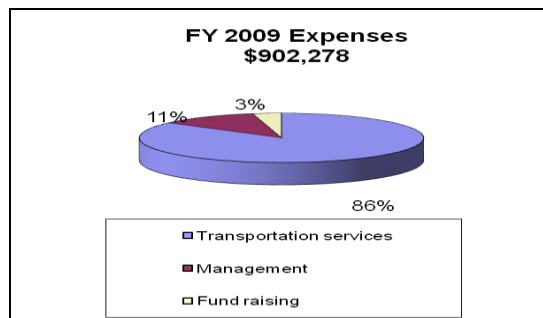
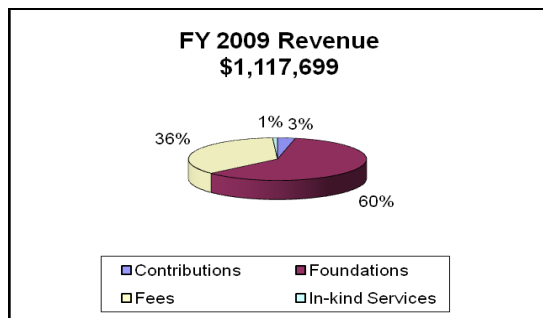
In addition, **27 organizations** in northeast Indiana were assisted with their transportation needs. This coordination was far more cost effective and dependable. Transportation was provided for seniors, persons with disabilities, low income individuals, children and youth. This service extends to northeast Indiana.

### New Location

In August, CTN moved its offices and vehicle storage to 20,000 square feet in the historic International Park. It is a central location with easy access in all directions. Inside storage for all of the vehicles paid off this past winter and will continue to reduce fuel consumption and vehicle maintenance costs. Come visit us anytime. 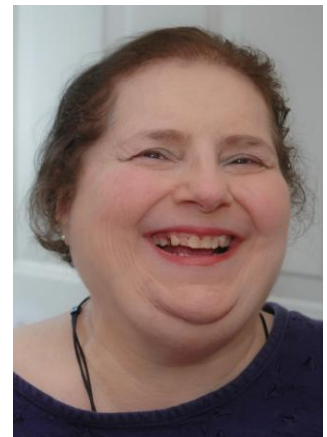
